Propeller RACINE, cargo merchandise, ashore at Forty Mile Point Lake Huron. Got off and towed to Milwaukee

The prop. RACINE, with a full cargo of merchandise, hence for Chicago and intermediate ports, went ashore last Thursday night, on Forty Mile Pt., Lake Huron. She is full of water. The propeller MICHIGAN, with 2 steam pumps, left Detroit last night to get her off.

ASHORE AND FULL OF WATER. -- The propeller RACINE, bound up laden with merchandise, ran ashore on Thursday night last at Forty Mile Point, Lake Huron. The propeller MICHIGAN has gone to her assistance with two steam pumps. The RACINE belongs to the People's Line of upper lake propellers.

The propeller RACINE has been raised, and was in Mackinac on the 23rd, preparing to go to Milwaukee in tow of the tug LEVIATHAN.
