The original and each copy of an application for a passport must have attached to it a copy of the applicant's photograph.
A loose signed photograph of the applicant must accompany the application.
The photograph must be on thin paper, should have a light background and be not over three inches in size.

Fee for passport, one dollar.
Fee for existing application, one dollar.

A woman's application must state whether she is married or not, and a married woman must prove that her husband is a native citizen.

I solemnly swear that I was born at Chicago in the State of Illinois, on or about the 7th day of October 1868 that my father Edison E. Honnell was born in Vermont and is now deceased My husband is William L. Honnell [that he emigrated to the United States from the port of (See his application to-day) (If the applicant's father or husband was born in this country, lines should be drawn through the blank in brackets.)

on or about 1899; that he resided 80 years, uninterruptedly, in the United States, from 1899 to 1899 at (See his application to-day); that he was naturalized as a citizen of the United States before the 1899 Court of (See his application to-day) at (See his application to-day)
