Myron Vent, Deputy at AID, Dies

Myron Hutzler Vent, 79, who retired in 1977 as deputy director of the office of education and human resources with the Agency for International Development, died Oct. 31 at Foxchase Nursing Home in Silver Spring. He had Parkinson's disease.

A resident of Chevy Chase, he had lived in the Washington area off and on since 1948.

Dr. Vent was a native of Chicago and a graduate of the University of Chicago. He received a master's degree in educational administration from Northwestern University and a doctorate in Germanics from the University of Maryland.

He served in the Army Air Forces in Europe during World War II, earning the Bronze Star. He was a civilian employee of the education division of the U.S. Office of Military Government in Berlin after the war.

Dr. Vent was principal of a high school in Empire, Mich., early in his career. In the early 1950s, he worked for UNESCO in Paris and the State Department's bureau for education and cultural affairs. He later worked for the U.S. Office of Education's international education division and administered a student exchange program for AID.

Dr. Vent was author of "South Manitou Island," a history of a Lake Michigan community, and co-author of "Pioneer Tales and Other Stories of South Manitou Island."

He was a recipient of AID's meritorious honor award.

Survivors include his wife, Henrietta Christel Vent of Chevy Chase; five children, Johanna Louise McPerson of Gaithersburg, Olivia Henriette Trutmann of Ithica, N.Y., Astrid Gale Mueller of Bethesda, Hans Myron Henning Vent of Washington and Joachim Detlef Vent of Germantown; a brother, William E. Vant of Batavia, Ill.; a sister, Fay Raidiger of Monrovia, Calif.; and five grandchildren.
