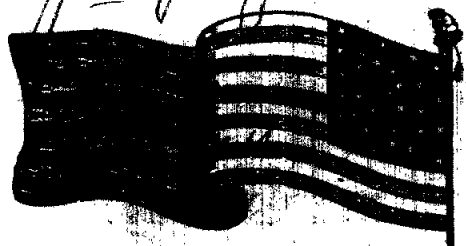

THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved March 3, 1855, entitled "An Act in addition to certain Acts granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States," there has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE,

Warrant No. 2249 for 160 acres, in favor of

Mary Freeburn
Widow of Thomas Freeburn
Private Captain Smith's Company
Pennsylvania Militia, War 1812

with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the Lots numbered one, two, three and four of section nineteen in township thirty two north of Range fourteen West, in the district of lands subject to sale at Praverse City Michigan, containing one hundred and ninety seven acres and thirty hundredths of an acre, Excess paid per Receiver's rec't No. 2752 1/2

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL the said warrant having been assigned by the said Mary Freeburn to John J. Bagley, in whose favor said tract has been located

NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said John J. Bagley as assignee as aforesaid and to his heirs

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said John J. Bagley as assignee as aforesaid and to his

heirs and assigns forever.
